

Description

Cette année le cours propose une réflexion sur l'imaginaire du feu au féminin. La femme au foyer, les flammes de l'amour, de la haine, les cendres et les braises de l'incendie ou du volcan renvoient à un symbolisme féminin qui diffère du portrait que l'on décline au masculin depuis G. Bachelard comme mysticisme et esprit de flamme verticale, celle de la chandelle, et plus récemment celle du feu, « Le feu, un des quatre éléments, énergie génératrice, est également inhérent à la nature même de l'homme, par la chaleur de son sang et de son haleine, jusqu'à la combustion de son corps. » Le corps et l'haleine se consument à la lecture ou à l'écriture des hommes, et ils peuvent s'y réchauffer, selon Nothomb. Pour les femmes, être corporellement incluses ou exclues du foyer renvoie aux braises et à la cendre, ou bien à des flammes tous azimuts de la sphère intime et peut-être publique.

Academic offenses :

In this course, students are permitted to use AI tools exclusively for information gathering and preliminary research purposes. These tools are intended to enhance the learning experience by providing access to diverse information sources. However, it is essential that students critically evaluate the obtained information, exercise independent thinking, and engage in original research to synthesize and develop their own ideas, arguments, and perspectives. The use of AI tools can serve as a starting point for exploration; however, students are expected to uphold academic integrity by appropriately attributing all sources and avoiding plagiarism. Assignments should reflect the students' own thoughts and independent written work. By adhering to these guidelines, students contribute to a responsible and ethical learning environment that promotes critical thinking, independent inquiry and allows them to produce original written contributions.

Plagiarism includes, but is not limited to, the unacknowledged use of AI tools, such as ChatGPT and Google Translate, to create content that is submitted as one's own. In this course, the use of AI (automatic translation tools, grammar checkers, ChatGPT...) is prohibited. If AI use is suspected, the instructor will ask for research notes, rough drafts, essay outlines, and other materials used in preparing assignments. Students are expected to retain these materials until after final grades have been entered. In the unlikely event of concerns being raised about the authenticity of any assignment, students may be asked to produce these materials; an inability to do so may weigh heavily against them.

PLAGIARISM CHECKING

All required papers may be subject to submission for textual similarity review to the commercial plagiarism detection software under license to the University for the detection of plagiarism. All

papers submitted for such checking will be included as source documents in the reference database for the purpose of detecting plagiarism of papers subsequently submitted to the system. Use of the service is subject to the licensing agreement, currently between The University of Western Ontario and Turnitin.com <http://www.turnitin.com>.

AI : Many students decide to run their work written in English or in other languages through linguee DeepL or Google Translate for their French essay. Though those systems are indeed amazing, and the linguists and computer programmers-mathematicians are admirable and produce superb results (I personally admire them), those practices leave obvious traces, and fabricate very odd patterns of expression. The use wholesale of Google Translate usually results in rather poor grades, and ChatGPT is really not recommended—in some cases, you get a zero—no second chance afterwards. If you intend to use ChatGPT to think for you be advised that it is very creative and will invent quotes when it cannot find them, it also invents aspects of literary history, of biography, and words. Since your profs tend to know the texts they teach you, you run the risk of getting yourself a zero (I know the texts I teach). I gave the first zero ever in the Winter semester of 2022 for this reason. Do not chance it.

On the other hand, if you type your work, for the journals for instance, use the trouble-shooting system of Word for your text: 1. “select all”; 2 in Tools select “Language” (roll down the list for the desired language) and ok. 3 check the highlighted words by clicking on them and DETERMINE if changes are desirable or not. For that you have to know the language. Proof yourself before printing your work because Word self-correct does not know everything, does not highlight every problem etc.: believe it or not, you know more than the machine. I prefer a nicely thought out handwritten journal with inserted documentation.
