Assess and prepare equipment	a) Back injury b) Overexertion strain c) Slip, trip, fall, d) electrocution	a) Assess and inspect equipment, test GFCI b) Carpet extractors to be appropriate size and method of operation c) Safely ensure footing and body position for awareness of slip, trip or falls, d) Avoid spillage of waste water or chemicals and filters, Follow manufacturer's guidelines. Also see any equipment labels and Caretaking Manual; Section D, page 6
Assign appropriate staff as required		Lead Caretaker and/or Manager organize crew to job requirements Re-instruct staff as required as to safe ergonomic operation
Removal of large debris or obstacles	Lacerations	Wear gloves appropriate for removal of such debris such as glass, staples or other such sharp objects, wear gloves for organic matter/waste cleanup
